Advent Outreach Projects:

This Advent, instead of a small group study, we will gather several intergenerational small groups to prepare blessing bags/plates/boxes for outreach to our community and beyond. You are invited to help us collect the items for the kits and then come help assemble, deliver, etc. You may help us gather items for one or many kits and then be part of as many small groups as you like. If you have questions, see Susie Mercer or call the church office. This Advent may Christ's light shine bright!

Advent Outreach Projects include:

CWS Hygiene Kit –Church World Service is in need of hygiene kits that are distributed to those who are evacuated or displaced during disasters. Due to the many severe storms and wildfires in recent months, the need is especially great as they restock in order to be prepared for the next disaster. We invite individuals/families to assemble kits during the Advent season and then meet as a small group to prepare them for shipment. This group will meet Thursday, December 27th at 11:00 a.m.

Kit includes:

One hand towel measuring approximately 15"x 28" to 16"x 32"

(no fingertip, bath, dish towel or micro-fiber)

One washcloth

One wide-tooth comb removed from the package

One finger nail or toe nail clipper removed from the package

One bath size bar of soap in the wrapper

One toothbrush in the package

Ten standard size Band-aids

All items need to fit inside a one-gallon plastic zipper closure bag. Remove the excess air from the bag and seal before boxing. Do not add any extra items or toothpaste. A tube of extended expiration date toothpaste will be added to each Hygiene Kit just prior to its journey.

Blessing Bags for residents in a local nursing home. These bags will include a few essentials that could come in handy for residents of one of our local nursing homes. This small group will meet at 6:00 p.m. on Sunday, December 16th.

The intent of this ministry is not to provide an entire Christmas for the child but to let the child know that their incarcerated parent has remembered them at Christmas.
