

#### *I Believe Even When...Fill the Night with Music and Light*

It is difficult not being able to gather for worship during the COVID pandemic and even when levels permitted us to gather, congregational singing was determined to be “too risky” for those gathered. But its difficult to imagine this season without music. So, we are going to fill the night with music and light this season. Each week we will explore in worship and discussion groups the transforming and reconciling power of music to change our world and our lives. We have good news to proclaim and we will do so this season through the power of music.

We will gather as we did for our parking lot drive-in services so we can “safely sing” in our cars while connecting with our musicians through our car radios. It will be a great way to connect with each other and enjoying the songs we love. Join us.

**Blue Christmas Service—December 13<sup>th</sup>** For many, the holiday season is not all joyful celebrations but rather a painful reminder of loss and sadness. 

We averaged 82 in attendance each week and had enjoyed some fun and fellowship in addition to worship. Our weekly drive-in services will take a break for the season of Advent and Christmas because we want to include more members of the congregation in our weekly worship leadership and can only do that through video which does not lend itself to the parking lot. We will however hold at least two special events during Advent in the parking lot (details above). After the first of the year, we will assess weather conditions and COVID levels and decide when to resume worship in our parking lot.

Also thank you to our band who each week inspired us with music; Susan Davis, Taylor Rhodes, Ben Appleby, Matt McCandlish & Tim Remster. ### **New in Our Library**

As long as you are staying at home this month, why not check out one of our new books in the church library and be inspired. Here are a few of the latest editions:

*Advent for Everyone: A Journey with the Apostles* by N.T. Wright provides readers with an inspirational guide through the Advent season, from the first Sunday in Advent through the Saturday after the Fourth Sunday in Advent. Popular biblical scholar and author N. T. Wright provides his own Scripture translation and brief reflection, helping readers understand Advent in the wider context of God's love.

In *Incarnation: Rediscovering the Significance of Christmas* by Adam Hamilton examines the names of Christ used by the gospel writers, exploring the historical and personal significance of his birth.

*The Characters of Christmas: Unlikely People Caught Up in the Story of Jesus* by Daniel Darling was written, to help you take a fresh look at the Christmas story by getting to know the minor characters that played a part in Jesus' birth, such as Zechariah and Elizabeth, the Shepherds, and Herod. As you slow down, engage your imagination, and enter into the stories of these women and men, you'll see the most important character—Jesus Christ—with new eyes.

### **Advent Movie & Discussion: *The Power of Music in the Midst of Difficult Times***

During the season of Advent our small group study will be a Film Festival including 5 documentaries on the power of music in difficult times. Participants will be invited to view one documentary each week and then gather on ZOOM for a discussion on the film Tuesday evenings at 7 p.m. beginning December 1<sup>st</sup>. You can join us for all five discussions or just some of them. These documentaries are all available either free on YouTube or for a nominal rental fee \$1.99 on Amazon Video. If you want to view the films but are unable to join the Zoom discussion group, we have material tailored to that as well. If you want to receive the information about viewing the films, let Dawn or the church office know and we will get you the information you need. Our first discussion will be December 1<sup>st</sup> so plan to watch the first film in advance of the discussion. If you have questions just ask Dawn. **Note:** These documentaries are appropriate for teens and adults but not for young children. However, we have put together a Family Film Festival for young families that will be available in the Advent workshop bags or just call the church office and request one.

### **Board Meeting Highlights—November 12, 2020**


- Zoom Board Meeting opened by Moderator Jason Kehrberg.

### **Week of Compassion Update Portland FCC Responds to Compound Disasters**

In the heart of downtown Portland, Oregon, First Christian Church has had a community feeding ministry in place for more than 25 years. Prior to the pandemic, they were distributing 100-125 sandwiches each week. When COVID-19 impacted the city, other downtown programs had to close their doors almost overnight. This left a big gap in services, with many people in need. But because FCC had existing relationships with many of those other ministries and services, they were able to move quickly to help fill the gap. With help from church members and volunteers, with support from Week of Compassion and other denominational grants for COVID-19 Relief, and in partnership with other community organizations, First Christian Church has been able to expand their capacity in a significant way. The church has increased the number of people they reach nearly tenfold. They have opened their doors to house a ministry that would otherwise have closed. And with deliveries of 7 tons of food per week from the Oregon Food Bank, church partners and volunteers sort and organize the food and help distribute the packages to neighbors in need. Because of their long-standing presence in the community, and long history of working to feed unhoused and lower income neighbors, the church also knew that a “one size fits all” approach to food distribution would not work in their neighborhood. Portland’s cultural diversity makes for unique needs among families from different cultural backgrounds. In order to honor those different cultures, and to preserve the dignity of those they serve, FCC works across their wide network of partners to exchange food where needed. Pastor Cynthia McBride offers the example of cheese -- while not a common ingredient for some families, it is a cultural staple for others; partners at FCC have been able to share and coordinate these resources. Eventually, they developed both an Asian pantry and a Latinx pantry.

With worship happening remotely, the building was almost entirely dedicated to the onsite feeding partnership, which grew to incorporate other downtown programs. The church also shared space to offer showers, laundry, and device charging for their houseless neighbors three days per week. Even without regular church programs happening, the building was seeing more traffic than usual.

Then, as the church continued to adapt to the needs of the pandemic, smoke from the wildfires that had affected so much of their state began to encroach upon the city. At one point, for a full week, Portland had the worst air quality in the world. It was hazardous, and people were not supposed to be outside at all. If you don’t have a house, that is an especially tough situation. This development posed further challenges to the newly expanded ministry at FCC, which had been happening primarily outdoors due to the pandemic. Now, the houseless neighbors-- many of whom were relying on the church for food support-- also had no place to go.

Through those challenging days of the wildfires, the people of First Christian continued responding to an ever-changing situation, working to meet the needs of some of their most vulnerable neighbors. With additional support from Week of Compassion, the church was able to offer water, as well as N-95 masks to their houseless friends. Filtration masks have been hard to come by during COVID-19-- and were especially appreciated by those living outdoors with the dangerous air quality every day.

“I’m so thankful for the congregation’s consistent response to the crisis,” says Pastor Cynthia McBride. “The response from the congregation has been one of thankfulness and gratitude. Some churches might say that if we can’t be in the building, nobody should, but that’s not the response here. It really reflects the heart of the congregation, that they want to care for neighbors in need... I’m humbled and honored to pastor with people who are passionate about the gospel and living out Christ’s call to love our neighbors.”

“Every gift the church has received has been helpful in underwriting this ministry... Week of Compassion has really been a blessing. We have the awareness that, in the midst of any crisis, as Disciples we know we are connected with people who care.”

As Portland First Christian Church continues to answer the call to serve their neighbors-- and serve WITH their neighbors-- in the midst of extremely challenging circumstances, our wider Church answers the call as well. Your gifts to Week of Compassion empower congregations like FCC to step up in times of crisis; to fill community needs when there are gaps; and to know that they are surrounded by a cloud of witnesses that reaches far beyond their own community, and beyond the sanctuary walls.
